Experience within the Drink think project in recent years indicates that it is crucial to focus on adults as much as young people. Even if those aged 18+ are not parents themselves, they still remain key influencers within the local community.

Some consideration should also be given to the inclusion of the licensed trade in this section as substantial impact is made to the culture of alcohol as a result of access adn availability of alcohol. Therefore community focused initiatives need to supported by parallel initiatives within the licensed trade.
