

# School vaccination clinics and COVID-19 (coronavirus)

School vaccination clinics will continue and it is important that your child continues to receive the vaccines they need when invited.

There may be changes to the usual processes at your child's school vaccination clinic in order to maintain a safe distance and to take all possible precautions to protect your child from COVID-19 (see next page).

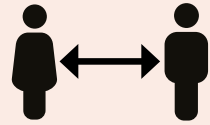
Your child should attend for their vaccinations unless they are unwell or self-isolating because they have COVID-19.

If your child has one or more symptoms of COVID-19 your child should not attend school. If your child has been invited to have a vaccination, you should phone the school nurse to find out what to do.
