
### Annual Report of the Needle & Syringe Exchange Scheme for the period 1st April 2013 to 31st March 2014

This report summarises data that is collected on the operation of the Northern Ireland Needle and Syringe Exchange Scheme (NSES). It relates to the twelve-month period between 1st April 2013 and 31st March 2014. The anonymised data is collected by the 14 pharmacies and 1 Trust-based service that participate in the Northern Ireland Needle and Syringe Exchange Scheme (NSES) which was introduced in April 2001.

## Location of services

Between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014 each Health & Social Care Trust in N. Ireland participated in the Scheme through 14 pharmacies and 1 Community Addiction Team Service based in Railway St, Ballymena. The services can be seen in the map (Figure 1). There are also three outreach services, two in Belfast and one in Ballymena.




### Number of Visits to the Pharmacies

A total of 22,742 visits to facilitate the exchange of needles and syringes were made to the service over the twelve month period between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013 and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014. This is an increase in demand of 1,522 (7%) visits on the 2012/13 figure (21,220). Table 1 and Figure 2

below show the number of visits by each Health and Social Care Trust. The Belfast Trust had the highest number of visits (45%) and the Southern Trust the lowest number of visits (3%).



# Number of Visits made by Health & Social Care Trust of Residents

Data collected by the pharmacies includes the first 4 digits of the client's postcode e.g. BT12 and this allows a restricted amount of analysis on the Trust of Residence of each client. Table 2 and Figure 3 shows the highest percentage of visits made was from residents of Belfast Trust (38%) and the lowest was from the Southern Trust (4%). A small number of postcodes (1%) were not submitted to the database and 12 visits were made by non-residents of Northern Ireland.

The number of visits made per 100,000 HSCT population can be seen in Table 3 ranging from the highest, Belfast Trust (2477 visits per 100,000 population) to the lowest, Southern Trust (269 visits per 100,000 population).



# Number of Packs Issued by Health & Social Care Trust

Table 4 and Figure 4 show the number and percentage of packs issued by each Trust through their participating pharmacies. The Belfast Trust issued the highest number of packs (39%) and the lowest number was issued by the Southern Trust (4%).



## Number and Percentage of Packs Issued to Outreach Workers

Needle Exchange outreach services are provided within 2 Trust areas in N Ireland: the Belfast Trust area and the Northern Trust area. In the Belfast area, outreach is provided by the Belfast Trust through the Belfast Drug Outreach Team and the Homeless Health Care Project. In the Northern area, it is provided by a voluntary organisation, Threshold. The outreach workers visit pharmacies to obtain packs on behalf of clients. Figure 5 shows the number and percentage of packs issued to outreach workers in the period 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014. Of the total packs issued to outreach workers, the highest number, 150 (64%), was issued to Belfast Trust staff while 36% of packs was issued to Northern Trust. Please note that concerns were raised about the quality of the 2012/13 Outreach data. Problems in this connection are being addressed.



# Age of Clients using the Needle & Syringe Exchange Scheme


The highest percentage of clients using the Scheme was in the 31 and over age band (53%) which is a 2% increase in last year's percentage. The 26-30 year old category saw a decrease of 3% in the visits made (23%). In the 18-25 age band, visits decreased by 1% from last year to 22% while there was a slight increase in the number of visits by the Under 18s. Table 5, 5a and Figure 6 show the numbers and percentages by age band. Please note the figures are shown by Trust of Residence of the client.




### Gender of Clients using the Needle & Syringe Exchange Scheme

Table 6 and Figure 7 illustrate the number and percentage of males and females using NSES by their Health & Social Care Trust of Residency. The service is used mainly by male clients (85%). The highest percentage of females using the service (19%) is in the Belfast Trust.

## Number of Clients injecting Opioids, Steroids, Stimulants and Other Drugs


Under the Scheme data defining the "user type" is collected on those injecting Amphetamines, Opiates, Steroids, Opiate & Steroid, Steroid & Tanning, Tanning and User Type Not Known. Two pharmacies issued packs to Insulin users. Participating pharmacies collected 68% of data on injecting detail which is a significant increase on last year (50%). Of the total visits to the Scheme it was recorded that 37% of users injected steroids rising to 38% when Steroid & Tanning are included in this figure. Those injecting opiates rose to 28%. Table 7 and 7a illustrate the various types of drug users who used the Scheme. Figure 8 charts the trend since 2012/13.



Figure 8 highlights that the increase from last year reflects an increase in reporting of User Type.






### Number and Percentage of Return of Bins

A cin bin is a sealed container which is used to safely dispose of used needles and syringes and the aim is for clients to return their used bins to the pharmacy for secure disposal. Each pack contains a bin. Clients may request extra bins and these are accounted for in the figures. During 2013/14 data shows that 49% of bins issued to users were returned, showing that the return rate has increased by 1% since 2012/13. The Western Trust had the highest number of bins returned (70%) and the lowest return rate of 41% was by Belfast Trust. Table 8 and Figure 9 shows the number and percentage of bins returned to pharmacies.

## **Cross Boundary Flow**

Table 9 illustrates the cross-boundary flow of clients accessing the Scheme. In comparing the Health & Social Care Trust of Residence of the client and the Trust of the Pharmacy that they visit it is noteworthy that 46.4% of clients from the South-Eastern Trust visit a pharmacy in the Belfast Trust. Of the clients who are residents of the Southern Trust 14.2% visit Belfast Trust pharmacies and 9% visit Northern Trust pharmacies. In the Western Trust 97% of clients visit a Western Trust Pharmacy.
